



Sandra Simić was born on 18 May 1974 in Pula, Croatia. She graduated law at the University of Rijeka – Faculty of Law in 1998 and joined the Law firm Bogdanović, Dolički & Partners from Zagreb, where she worked as law trainee (1998 – 2001), passed the Bar Exam (2000) and was fully admitted to the Croatian Bar Association as Attorney at Law (2002 – 2005), continuing the practice at the same law firm. She practiced company law, civil law and family law, represented clients at court and arbitral proceedings, advised foreign clients on legal aspects of investments in Croatia and participated in many due diligence projects.

She joined Croatian Securities and Exchange Commission (later Croatian Financial Services Supervisory Agency) on 1 June 2005, as Senior Legal Advisor in the Supervision Sector II – Capital Markets Department. She completed a specialized educational program *Capital Markets: Regulation and Development* at the International Law Institute in Washington D.C., in collaboration with Georgetown University, in 2007. Sandra was a member of the working group drafting the new Croatian Capital Markets Act in the part of Market Abuse. She held many presentations on this subject.

She wrote the first handbook issued by the Croatian Financial Services Supervisory Agency named *New Capital Market*, which was distributed without charge and is available for free on the website of the Agency in its electronic form. The handbook was written for the purpose of promoting financial literacy in Croatia. From October 2009 she continued to work at the Agency as Chief Advisor.

Sandra is a postgraduate student at the University of London, Queen Mary, where she is currently specializing European and Public International Law, by distance learning.

Sandra speaks Croatian (native), English, Spanish and Italian, and is currently learning French.
